Pecha Kucha Presentation

An the EUKI conference we would like to highlight the new EUKI projects which have been chosen in the 3rd EUKI call for project ideas in a special way. For this, we would like you to prepare a Pecha Kucha Presentation and to choose one person of your project to present it at the conference in front of the audience.

What is Pecha Kucha?

Pecha Kucha is about speaking through images to increase visual attention. Classically, a certain number of images are presented for 20 seconds each. It is important that only the images will be projected on the wall behind you and that you speak freely to it. This is supposed to make your presentation on the one side precise and on the other an entertaining alternative for the audience. Please take the task with a little humour. This is not about a complete presentation of your project but a first impression that will remain in the audience's memory. [Here](#) you can see a good example of one.

What do we need from you?

For the conference the presentation time is limited to **2 min per project**. This means that you will need a

- **Powerpoint presentation of 6 slides/ 6 images.*** Each image will be displayed for 20 seconds only.
- Please do not use text in your presentation, **just pictures and maybe headlines or buzz words.**
- The **first slide/picture should be a music cover** (for example the cover photo of "Beatles: Abbey Road"), which should serve as an introduction to your presentation and a "motto" of your work.
- The other slides/pictures and how you want to present your project are up to you. Maybe you can let your music cover inspire you to be creative.
